JULY—Administrative Council Highlights: (Please note the ways you can help.)

The Administrative Church Council met on July 9, 2020 and addressed the following business of the church:

Secretary, Treasurer, and Financial reports were reviewed and accepted as presented.

Finance—Fund balances were reviewed and allocation for transferring money from General Fund to Trustee Fund for parking lot expenses was approved. Mark Baird reported that the audit is complete. Gerry Lininger reported additional donations from memorial funds in memory of Tom Spain were used toward the purchase of media equipment. **Thank you!!!**

Pastor's Report—Pastor Carolyn updated the Council with information regarding the use of our church as a possible meeting site for Narcotics Anonymous. She met with the director of Logan Co./Champaign Co. Board of Mental Health and some Logan Co. court officials regarding services for helping those struggling with addiction or mental health conditions. Several of their suggestions were shared with Council and it was moved and seconded for our church to enter into a contracted agreement for meetings possibly on Fridays from 12-4 PM. Other steps and opportunities to expand our outreach were discussed and will be better defined in future meetings as we get the geographical plotting of our congregants completed and review it with our goals for the future.

Worship—Pastor Carolyn reported on current sanitary measures, social distancing and worship concerns. We will allow and encourage the use of the side doors as exits from the sanctuary to the parking lot following worship. We have adjusted how we receive Holy Communion in light of the concerns regarding the virus. It seems to be working well. In addition, the team suggested the use of colored wristbands to indicate our level of interaction/contact with one another. (Red-social distancing; Yellow-cautious, not touching; Green-open for hugs and high fives). We encourage the use of wristbands and the masks that are available and optional. We have considered outdoor or drive-in services as well as additional indoor services (which when surveyed, had only a single request), but feel that these are not prudent options at this time due to the summer heat and uncertainty of the weather from week to week. The online option is there for those who do not wish to attend in person in the sanctuary. Team is considering an outdoor service at the park sometime in September. Media Team is working to address the technical problems with our screens and online worship feed.

Outreach—Dave Hardman reported that \$14,995 was pledged to Faith Promise missions. We thank everyone for their continued support and for a successful Faith Promise Sunday.

Youth Ministry/Education Team—Heather Hawley reported the team is meeting via email to continue discussion regarding Vacation Bible School. The plans and schedules are being revised. The theme is built around the stories in the Sanctus Real song "Confidence." Details will be announced soon and sign-up sheets are in the narthex for volunteers to help.

Backpack Ministry—No report.

Ladies Circle—No report.

Staff/Pastor-Parish (SPRC)—Rob Drumm reported the Committee will be meeting with paid staff for annual review. Discussion has taken place regarding the staffing of the nursery and cleaning/sorting of toys.

Trustees—Seth Allen reported that the Trustees are taking the necessary preparations for a church workday following worship sometime in August or September. There are several items in need of cleaning, painting, repair or disposal, specifically benches and sheds outside. There are also several maintenance needs at the parsonage to address. We need able bodies to paint, stain, build/rebuild as well as those with organizational skills!

With racial tension being a headline story these days, what can we do to talk with our kids about it? How do we discuss something that most of our children don't witness regularly but must be aware of? Rev. F. Willis Johnson shares some guidance in his book *Holding Up Your Corner: Talking About Race in Your Community (Abingdon Press, Dec. 2016). He uses the Book of Esther as an example for how we can best address racism.*

Take a look at Chapter 4 in the Book of Esther. The entire Jewish community is in a perilous place. People fear for their lives. Leaders are in disagreement and disarray. Finally, one leader, Mordecai, tells another, Esther, **this is not the time to quibble, be quiet, or quit**. "Maybe it was for a moment like this that you came to be part of the royal family" (Esther 4:14 CEB). Before we consider what to do, it's helpful to know what not to do.

He moves on to explain how we can use Mordecai's advice in today's world. **Let's not quibble.** Here we talk with our children about the fact the racism exists in many forms and has taken place all over the world and even in our own community. Spend time looking together at definitions and examples. It's not about whose life matters or a slogan or a protest, with our kids it's about ALL lives mattering.

Let's not be quiet. With this topic in the forefront of our world right now we can't afford to be quiet about it. Esther tried to solve her people's problems by quietly scurrying around until Mordecai challenged her to step out of her comfort zone and do something about it. Even a conversation with your child about race relations can be daunting but this is not a time to be quiet. Their perspective might be refreshing for you as well.

Finally, as in Esther, **we must not quit!** If all people are made in God's image they must be treated as such. Ask your child what they see, what they have experienced and what they think could correct the wrongs in our world. Get them thinking about it now. Rev. Willis says it this way:

"For a moment like this" translates as now. We can't sit around in our ashes, thinking the time to act has passed, or not yet arrived. It is not a singular time. It is always, every time. Anne Frank wrote, "How wonderful it is that nobody need wait a single moment before starting to improve the world." So, the pressure is off! We no longer need to find the right time. It is always now.

Take this advice and **talk about it** with your children and those around you and strive to share the love of Christ.
