DOING OUR BEST TO KEEP YOU INFORMED

FEBRUARY—Administrative Council Highlights: (Please note the ways you can help.)

The Administrative Church Council met on February 11, 2021 and addressed the following business of the church:

- > Secretary, Treasurer, and Financial reports were reviewed and approved as presented.
- **Finance**—No report other than those approved above.
- ➤ Pastor's Report—Pastor Carolyn presented her monthly report regarding the use of her time and reminded Council of the Secretary's Office Hours on Wednesday and Thursday mornings from 9 AM to noon. Council also responded to questions regarding the lack of generational diversity among our community of faith and ways we might expand our reach.

We reviewed the <u>Winter Weather Policy</u> in light of our online options now for worship. **Our current policy will remain in place at this time** and can be found in this issue of The Messenger. Any adjustments to this schedule due to travel conditions will be communicated through One Calls, posted on Facebook page, and shared with WPKO radio station.

We have a team of individuals equipped and willing to help congregation and community members get through the process for receiving the Covid vaccine. Please contact Pastor Carolyn or the church office if you need assistance or are willing to help others.

- ➤ Worship Report—We are planning for a baptism and for new members transferring their memberships at the end of February. Plans are continuing for Scout Sunday on March 14th. Plans for Holy Week consist of a skit for Palm/Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday service, and Good Friday service (with Rev. Kathy Reiff preaching/leading). Easter morning plans are for a breakfast (Ladies Circle is taking over the planning for this) and worship at 9:30. We'll continue to work with the Education Team in regard to plans for children and an egg hunt.
- ➤ Youth Ministry/Education Team—Pastor Carolyn read a letter of resignation from Youth Leader received Heather Hawley. She will begin to transition out of this role as the SPRC begins a new search to fill this position. We thank Heather for all her efforts and time devoted to serving our children and youth. There is no other news to report from Education since the meeting in January as groups continue to meet.
- The Staff/Pastor-Parish (SPRC) will meet with the Education Team to discuss the best way to transition as the position is re-opened and new interviews are held for the Youth Leader position. The SPRC also has some other personnel matters to address and will be meeting soon to discuss them.

- > **Outreach**—Nothing to report.
- ➤ **Backpack Ministry**—We are now packing 17 backpacks each week. The issue of backpacks not being returned has been addressed and many have been returned.
- ➤ Ladies Circle—Patti Levingston reported in Cindy Drumm's absence. They are planning to once again collect for the Food Pantry during the month of March and will be creating a list similar to the Reverse Advent Calendar for Lent. The food drive will end with a continental breakfast on Sunday, March 21st. The Ladies will coordinate the Easter breakfast in April. And May activities will include the Cookie delivery and annual Mother's Day banquet.
- ➤ Trustees—Seth Allen quickly updated Council on the committee work and maintenance needs of the church. We are still awaiting a quote from Best Door & Window for the replacement of windows in the Fellowship Hall and in the office area and classrooms at the front. The Fellowship Hall floor has been finished and buffed will soon be buffed. Alicia will work on making a video of all our property for insurance coverage, working on it the inside during the winter months and will complete the outside in the spring. We received a quote to clean the air ducts and felt this was beyond the scope of our needs at this time. Discussion continued regarding the sale of the trailer as we gather specifications and an estimated value. We have a purchased a sample chair for new chairs in the library. And our men are keeping an eye on a furnace that was fixed but we may be replacing it and some AC units in the spring.
- ➤ **Media**—Nothing new to report except that we now have YouTube channel for the church.
- **Fellowship**—Patti Levingston will take over leadership of this team as Mary Jaunzemis tends to her health.
- > **Old business:** None.
- ➤ New business: None.
- > Prayer concerns were shared and meeting adjourned with prayer.

Blessed in Eight Ways

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ.

Ephesians 1:3

What if your real estate agent's only description of a house she has found for you is this: "You're going to love it! It's got everything you need!" Would you sign on the dotted line based only on that description? Because the agent knows your family's needs and desires, her description of the house is probably accurate. But there's something about knowing the details that gives you assurance that this house really will meet your needs going forward.

The apostle Paul wrote a statement in Ephesians 1 similar to the real estate agent's general description. He wrote that we have been "blessed ... with every spiritual blessing ...in Christ" (verse 3). That covers it, right? What more do we need to know? Thankfully, Paul went on to enumerate eight of those spiritual blessings for our comfort: We are chosen (verse 4), adopted (verse 5), accepted (verse 6), redeemed (verse 7), enlightened (verses 8-9), given an inheritance (verses 11), sealed (verse 13), and secured (verse 14).

Are you blessed today? Yes, in at least eight different ways—blessed with every spiritual blessing in Christ.

Every blessing God has for man is in and through Jesus Christ.
