It is summer and half the year is over! Now we are living amidst protests and riots and a call for radical change in our law enforcement and judicial system. I don't know about you, but I'm not sure how much more I can take. There's so much uncertainty about so much including how school and sports programs will function in returning to classes, etc. I'm holding on to the one joy we have as a family that we hope to celebrate in 2020 with the wedding of our son, Zach to his fiancée Jessica. Their going through changes as they embark on a new life transition to owning a home and setting up a household together. Some, in our congregation, are transitioning in other ways, like moving out of their home to live elsewhere. No matter who we are or how old we are, most of us have sacrificed and given up something in these tumultuous days. We're living in the grief of disappointments caught in a cycle of perpetual change. I talked about that some last month, so I won't dwell on it in this issue.

So, how can we move forward in this time of change and letting go? Just keep moving in faith one step at a time. What could God be doing in all of this? I think God is calling us back to him. I think God wants us to seek him for truth and to seek him in his Word. I think God is giving the people of this country an opportunity to look deeper within. If only we could see the sinfulness in our hearts because even now, much of it remains hidden. While not all are lost and separated from God, many still live apart from total surrender. We sinners who are saved by grace are not exempt. We are not completely holy and sinless yet. And all kinds of new terms are floating around out there in the media (our enemy of the day) giving us an opportunity to search for knowledge and understanding, argue & debate, reflect, dialogue, etc. We will support or oppose the ideas presented to us. It all depends on what worldview we choose to adopt. I pray that we can learn to look at things from a biblical worldview, a godly perspective to the degree it is possible.

How do you determine what is true in order to respond in godly fashion?

ANSWER: READ THE BIBLE!!! DIG DEEP INTO HIS WORD AND YOUR RELATIONSHIP WITH CHRIST!!!

Please test the ideas coming from our current cultural society. Question these ideas and view them in the light of Scripture. Do the ideas so often promoted align with God's design, his promise, and his plan for humanity? Most likely they will not because the world hated Christ and evil still roams the earth seeking to destroy us.

Allow me to be specific for a moment. Racism. Is the concept of race biblical? No, tribes perhaps division of languages, but there is no definition of skin color. That is a totally manmade concoction. We are ALL part of ONE race, the human race. Does the Bible condone inequality of existed? Or, are not all ONE in Christ Jesus. "There is no Jew or slaves even when slavery Gentile, slave or free, male or female." We've all been broken because of experiences with other wounded people. Love God and through that relationship, God will help you to forgive and love all, including your enemies and those with whom you disagree. He is able. No one said that continually surrendering all of your life and heart would be easy or unintentional. God continues to expose our sins and correct us as he examines our hearts. But, with the help of Jesus, the burdens we carry can be made lighter when laid upon him. Turn, walk with him, and let him free your heart to love even the most unlovable. Unity is found when we all come together in Christ Jesus; when every knee will bow and every tongue confesses that Jesus IS Lord! Don't try to be God or let others convince you that they are God and know what is best of have all the answers, myself included. Seek the all-powerful, all-knowing God of scripture.

JUNE—Administrative Council Highlights: (Look for the ways you can help.)

The Administrative Church Council met on June 11, 2020 and addressed the following business of the church:

Secretary, Treasurer, and Financial reports were reviewed and accepted as presented.

Finance—Fund balances were reviewed. Gerry Lininger reported the amount of memorial funds used toward the purchase of media equipment. Gifts came from the families of Ellen Organ, Alberta Craig, Don Roush, and Nancy Hardin. **Thank you to these families!!!**

Some discussion regarding the use of the church debit card was shared and Mark Baird reported that the church audit is almost complete. Also, there has been no activity on apportionments at this time.

Pastor's Report—Pastor Carolyn reported the use of her time during the COVID pandemic. She shared the results and the reasoning behind the recent worship survey regarding a second service during the summer months and reported that there would be NO additional services offered.

Pastor led the Council leadership in discussion regarding their responses to the following two questions: (responses are included for you)

WHAT PROBLEM NEEDS SOLVED IN OUR COMMUNITY?

- * Lack of compassion for those with addiction issues
- * Creating a more cohesive community
- * Drug & alcohol addictions and suicides among young people
- * More community spirit

WHAT BREAKS YOUR HEART?

- *Any kind of animal neglect or cruelty
- * People in need—many types of needs, from physical to emotional, relational & everything in between
- * The invisible children who have been living in fear during this COVID shutdown
- * Lack of commitment of parents to have kids attend Bible school

How might we address these problems and what can we commit to do to help people? How will we build relationships with them?

One recommendation was to offer our church building as a site for NA/AA/Al-Anon groups to meet. Pastor Carolyn is pursuing conversations with county boards and courts. After some discussion, we realized that we need to define "our community" in order to build better relationships in new ways, especially since social restrictions are still in place. We will begin to "map" our congregation and review demographics, etc. while continuing to promote our church and advertise our events through social media.

Outreach—Dave Hardman reported on the preparations for Faith Promise Sunday presentations in worship, the pledge cards are available, and support for missions continues.

The church has really been able to be a blessing to those in need around the world through the extraordinary generosity of the congregation as we once again exceed pledge amounts.
