But here's the good news...he also gives us his Spirit to dwell in us to help us. You've heard the saying... "Life is a journey, not a destination." Well folks, it IS about the journey with God toward our eternal destination. To me, both are of importance. And the destination is dependent on the companionship of Christ on the journey.

Please note that Ad Council consists of largely of committee chairpersons. I look forward to serving alongside all of you in the coming new year. Now, let us look a step further beyond the life of the church to our daily call to wholly offer ourselves to God's service.

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God-this is your true and proper worship.—Romans 12:1 (NIV)

What does it mean to offer oneself completely to God?

There is no part of your life that is kept from God. You allow His Word and his truths to **permeate every aspect of your life**—of your mind, body, and spirit. You don't compartmentalize who you are on Sundays from who you are at work, at home, or at play.

God isn't just a Sunday thing and your daily walk and learning doesn't just take place in Sunday morning worship. It's MORE than that.

Prayer is a constant, posturing yourself humbly before God and confessing your need for him. Consulting him in every decision you make from the big to the small.

Maybe I've shared this before, but I do not understand how people can compartmentalize their lives, limiting God's power in their lives by putting Jesus in a box and only allowing him to affect certain parts of your life. I confess that one of my greatest frustrations is that I cannot understand how people choose to accept worldly values that are in direct opposition to God's Word. How can you follow God but adhere to such ungodly values? I do not understand political division among so-called Christians (yes, I said "so-called" Christians) because God's children rebel against the Father Creator's Word and intention for humankind. I do not understand those who say they are Christian yet do not value the sanctity of life and support abortion. I do not understand those who support same-sex marriage in the church. In the world, perhaps, (it can become civil law) but NOT in the church, (not church law). God's marriage covenant is reserved for a man and a woman. Case closed. Scripture cannot be twisted and distorted to say anything else. Now I know that may sound harsh and unchristian to some, but not if you adhere to the instruction God has provided to us. You not if you dive deep into the study of Scripture in history and context.

I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree together, so that there may be no divisions among you and that you may be united in mind and conviction.—1 Corinthians 1:10

In 2020, the church leadership will begin conducting some round table discussions regarding the future of our local congregation in regard to the denomination's future over this debate over homosexuality marriage and leadership (specifically ordination) in the church. Dates and times for these discussions have not yet been established, but we will make every attempt to keep you informed of the various sessions as plans unfold. I will try to continue to include information from the global-wide denominational news. More and more will be in the news as we approach General Conference 2020 in May in Minneapolis. History will likely be made in an attempt for the denomination to separate/split into two or three different theological sects under an "umbrella" of Methodism over this issue. So, we, as a local congregation will need to decide where we are going to land when this debate is all over. We can't know the future for certain, but we can forecast the options and be prepared when the time comes. A vote of the membership will likely be taken following the General Conference. Only members of the church will have a vote, but all constituents (attenders) can have voice. You can find information on each sect by researching the Wesleyan Covenant Association (WCA-traditional), Mainstream UMC (claims to be 'in the middle' on the issue), and the UMC Next (progressive). Please understand that the leadership of the church endorses the traditional stance regarding homosexuality, same-sex marriage, and ordination and last month agreed to join and support the WCA.

I wish we didn't have to spend time in these discussions for there are far greater things for us to involve ourselves in regarding the mission of the church. At the same time, we cannot allow false doctrine to invade the teachings of the church. Please understand that most of us on this side of the debate understand that none of us are perfect, that we all are sinners who fall short of the glory of God. All are welcome in the church as we journey closer to God and God transforms us. We are not against people, only the lifestyle. The real issue is in the **endorsement or approval** of a lifestyle and practice that God condemns as sin and considers outside his will for his people. The church is to stand COUNTER to culture, not to accept this lifestyle as truth or that God created some this way, unless you want that to mean we were born with wrong affections (called the sinful nature). In the church and in scripture we refer to this human tendency as, "sinful, fleshly desires." Not every "feeling" we have is necessarily from God just because we feel or experience it inside ourselves at a given time. Satan tempts us with his lies. (Ex.-I used to feel totally worthless for not being perfect and I still struggle with that thought; that feeling of not being good enough to have worth. However, God's truths tell me differently. I have great worth as a child of God in whom my Father takes delight. When I focus on the truth of his Word, he can transform my life from those lies I have believed. He frees me from the feelings of self-condemnation, though I am a work in progress.)

Acting upon homosexual desires is sinful the same as acting in greed, self-righteousness, pride, anger, bitterness, jealousy, envy, and unforgiveness, just to name a few common temptations. I am not saying that anyone is superior to anyone else, but that we all stand in need of a Savior. But, saying that homosexuality is permissible among God's people will not make it any more of an acceptable practice when it comes to God's judgment upon us. We will eventually be held accountable for our behavior. If not held accountable to one another, we are always held accountable to God. And, our position will affect how God blesses us because he stands with the righteous and blesses those who are obedient to his teaching and leading. And I hope that people on all sides of the issue will participate in our discussions. Please continue to lift our denomination and our nation in your prayers as we battle the attacks of principalities and powers in an unseen world. You know that I often say that we weak Christians give Satan and his angels too much power when we should be living in the victory of Christ who has overcome the world!

I appreciate all the opportunities there are to accomplish this, from personal study plans, to Christian radio programming, to the Bible accessible on our phones. One of the most rewarding venues of spiritual growth for me, is the small group studies offered right here at Middleburg UMC. If you are not a regular attender of one of the pastor-led Bible studies or participant in Sunday School, I encourage you to give it a try in 2020.

Most recently, I've been attending the Sunday School class Sally Stierhoff is leading, teaching us the SOAP method of reading the Bible. Scripture, Observation, Application and Prayer can reveal new truths when I ask the Holy Spirit to be with me during my study time. Let me share a taste of this...

What God has chosen to tell us is *reliable*. 5) Just as God foretold of Christ's suffering, which did come to pass, God foretells of a Time Of Restoration of All Things!

A: It would behoove me to be familiar with what God has revealed; it's for my own good, to help me prepare myself for the rest of my days here and for eternity. He wants me to know these things! "The Time of Restoration of All Things"- how beautiful to be able to know that all things will be restored! Our land, relationships, health, peace, prosperity, rightness with God's plan, walking with Him in a garden! Bureaucracy and corruption will disappear!

P: Oh thank you, Father, for sharing things with your children. Things to guide, protect, warn and inform us. Thank you that your promises are air tight. I can bet my life on them! What reassurance and hope, what peace it gives my soul to be reminded that in Your time, all things will be restored. I don't have to wish and wonder if it will. You have already ordained it. - Restoration already exists! 
